Happy Spring almost Everyone,

There will be a cash bar with everything starting around 6pm and going till 10ish. Everyone in attendance will get a \$10 complimentary card from the casino. Dinner will be 7-8:30 and we will have a message or two for everyone but after that we want everyone to be able to dance and have a good time and maybe even gamble a bit.

This fall I'm working on a cruise through Norwegian Cruise Lines. There are several things we still need to complete as far as Imperial Law and I will be formally presenting my proposal at the next Stated Meeting. For planning sake, I'm looking at October 3 through the 7th Leaving Miami on the 3rd at 5pm, Grand Bahama Island on the 4th, Nassau on the 5th, the Great Stirrup Cay on the 6th and return to Miami on the 7th for those that are

Lady Connie and I would really love to have as many nobles in attendance and your ladies as possible as I said with my Pin this year we are attempting to think outside the box not only for things for us to do as Shriners but also other ways that our philanthropy can help those in our communities as well as attracting the new masons and members to our fraternity. We hope to see many of you at the next stated meeting and also at the circus's coming up as well, and one last thing if you have a thought about something don't sit on it, if it's something that we can do and accomplish and we have the means please let us know. If it's something we cannot do right now but may be able to in the future then we as a Divan will hold it in regards to look to the future, and if you Ladies have any ideas about stuff you would like to do please feel free to let Lady Connie know we will work towards it. We may not be able to accomplish everything but we will try and accomplish something.

One last thing to bring down to earth Gentleman, Nobles, Brothers all we are not getting any younger and as I said prior we, not just me but WE must find our replacements for our clubs and units, WE must get back out into the Blue Lodges and not only help them but support them in all their undertakings. 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New Membership Cards Issued by Shriners Intl

Shriners International began issuing hard plastic membership cards in 2016. There have been some issues with the initial cards, but Shriners HQ remains confident they will all be resolved.

Many of you have no doubt received your new hard plastic membership card from Shriners International. The card is just one step in an aggressive program by Shriners International to modernize its membership system across the fraternity. The scope of this modernization is substantial and it has not been without a few issues. I would like to briefly make you aware of the issues and let you know what we've been trying to do at the Temple level to address them. Please feel free to contact me if you have questions.

New Membership System

Although not visible to the general membership, Shriners International did away with our prior membership system aka 'Red Fez' and replaced it with a new centrally managed web-based system known as 'Web Fez'. The system is very much a work in progress and the home office is actively building portions of the program while we use it. This hasn't proved too much of a problem. We have found many of the reports we were able to generate in the prior system, are still being built. Its mainly a matter of waiting until they bring them online. Though not available at this time, the new system is going to allow for club and member level access for select club/unit officers.

Dues Notices

Shriners International has taken over the process of sending dues notices to the nobility. This has been a bit of a change for us at the Saladin office, but nothing too bad. The only hiccup in the process was that Shriners International used our old address on the dues notices they sent out to the nobility. Thankfully the mail-forwarding order was still in place from our old address. However, some dues payments were returned to members as undeliverable. Not an ideal situation for us in the office. We apologized to anyone that called in to the office to report they had received their payments back. It wasn't anything we did wrong in the office and we worked with headquarters to make sure the problem did not occur again.





Dues Cards


Because of unforeseen issues, it took Shriners International longer than expected to issue the new plastic cards. I made a choice early on to issue the traditional paper cards to everyone paying their dues in 2016 to make sure you received something in a timely manner.

The hard plastic cards are produced for Shriners International at a central location and are done in batches every few weeks. Shortly after they began arriving to members we started to receive calls in the office that the cards lacked titles and membership classes such as: Past Potentate, Life Member, PCM, PCLM, \$100 Million Club, etc. etc. We learned later that the titles were omitted by Imperial this first year because of issues in combining the membership databases of the Temples across the country. There are plans to correct this. I have made a document available online that explains this in greater detail:
