Shriners Patient Ambassador to vist in Oct



Following on the heels of the very impressive speech we received from Dr. Pravin Patel of Chicago Shriners Hospital, we are very blessed to announce Shriners Hospitals for Children Patient Ambassador Leigh Dittman will visit our October Stated meeting and share with us her message of *Love to the Rescue* in support Shriners Hospital for Children.

Leigh and her family have raised over \$500,000 for Shriners Hospitals for Children. She has said she is on a quest to raise \$1 million.

Leigh was diagnosed at birth with osteogenesis imperfecta (OI), also known as brittle bone disease. OI is a genetic disorder characterized by



Our Spring Ceremonial was a huge success with the largest number of candidates we have had initiated in some years: 21.






